Jonathan Greenberg

-  **Restoring Library Hours:** Jonathan founded the Campaign to Restore Library Hours which put Measure M on the ballot. Measure M would bring in \$10 million per year to resolve the worst library funding crisis in county history.
-  **Opening Our Hospital:** As a leader in the community's effort to reopen the Palm Drive emergency room, Jonathan's investigations challenging the legal tactics taken by the Board have transformed the hospital reopening debate.
-  **Measure R's Four New Taxes:** Like the Press Democrat, I oppose new taxes for cell phones, home phones, garbage and cable. I continue to challenge excessive spending on consultants, new hires & 20% pay raises for select staffers.
-  **Traffic and the CVS Project:** This project only advanced because of an erroneous traffic report. Jonathan uncovered, wrote about, and advocated against these errors. This helped galvanize public opposition to the project.
-  **Building Bike Lanes:** Sebastopol is the only city in Sonoma County without bike lanes. Jonathan has been a leading advocate for budgeting bike lanes.
-  **Electric Vehicles for City Fleet:** Jonathan is a strong advocate for including electric vehicles in the budget. The City staff has created a \$4.6 million, 20 year vehicle replacement plan that does not contain a single electric car.

-  Has done nothing to support the **library reopening effort**. Voted against local funding that could restore hours sooner.
-  Despite signing resolution to help, has done nothing to assist in reopening **Palm Drive Hospital**.
-  Supports **Measure R's** four new taxes. Approves current spending.
-  Championed and voted for the **faulty traffic report** and the **CVS project**.
-  Headed "Smart Streets" without budgeting one new **bike lane**. Approved \$8 million capital budget without a dollar for bike lanes.
-  Made no public comment, action or request for **electric vehicles**.
